


The annexed is a plot of lots offered for sale by
Col. Charles W. Burwell.


LOT No. 19 is 82 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet in front



No. 9, of 10^A bounded: Beginning at a stake by a road at 13, thence
west & a chestnut oak & a pine on the top of Brushy Mountain on a line of the land Logan Snyder's bought of Chapman at 16, thence
southeast 10 rods to a white oak at 14, then 10 rods to a stake by the road at 3 & along it \$ 62 40 18 poles to the beginning.

No. 10. of $10\frac{1}{4}$ acres: Beginning at a stake by a road at 3, thence S 10 E. 80 poles to a white oak on the top of a ridge of the Brushy Mountain corner to the land Logan Snyder bought of Chapman at 14, & with a line there of N 55 E 23 poles, N 11 W. 72 poles to the road at 4, thence along the same S 75 W. 22 poles to the beginning.

No. 1. of 9 3/4 acres is bounded to wit: Beginning at a small pine by a road at A, thence N 88 W 25 poles to a stake at 2. S 11 E 68 1/2 poles to a stake by a road at 3, thence along the road N. 75 E 22 poles to a line of Logan Snyder's land at 4, & with the same N. 10 W. 58 poles to the beginning.

No. 2, of 10 acres. Beginning at a stake by a road at 2, thence N. 88 W. 22. poles to a stake West of John Day's gate at 5, S. 10 E. 76 1/2 poles to a stake and a pile of stone S. 94. of a chestnut at 6, thence along a road N. 62 E. 24 poles to a stake at 3. N. 11 W. 68 1/2 poles to the beginning.

No. 3. of 10½ acres. Beginning at a stake west of John Day's gate at 5, thence S 10° E 7½ poles to a stake & a pile of stones S.W. of a chestnut at 6, thence along a road S. 62° W. 12 poles S. 37° W. 11 to a stake & a pile of stones at 8, N. 10° W. 92 poles to a stake in a field, at S. 68° E 30 poles to the beginning.
