


MAP OF SURV J.E.BRUBECKER

to J.E. Brubecker Oct. 9, 1909.

Description of a tract of land surveyed for J.E. Brubecker, situate, lying and being in Roanoke County on Peters Creek, adjoining the lands of S.H. Hubbard, W.W. Goodykoontz, Jacob Showalter and C.D. Layman, and it being known as the Elias Brubecker (deceased) land. And being the same tract conveyed to the said J.E. Brubecker by F.H. Eller & Joseph Brubecker by deed dated Feb. 13th 1900 and of record in office of the Clerk of Roanoke Co. in deed book No. 23 and page 35 and with metes and bounds as follows to wit:

Beginning at a stone on the North side of the Bushy road and corner to Jacob Showalter and with his line N 30° 1' 188 poles to a stone of double Chestnut on south side of ridge and corner to Showalter & W.W. Goodykoontz, thence with line of Goodykoontz S 72° W 67.13° to a stone at White Oak stump on east side of branch, corner to Garst and others; thence S 34° 30' W 48 poles to a stone corner to S.H. Hubbard and the 30 acre tract; thence S 32° 15' W 74.60 poles to a stone of a red oak on the flat; thence S 31° 15' W 62.75 poles to a stone at the upper end of a bottom east of Hubbards residence; thence S 21° 40' E 11.87 poles to a stone with three locust pointers; thence S 32° 40' W 29.21 poles to a stone opposite Hubbards residence; thence S 67° 15' W 23.57 poles to a stone near bridge in front of Hubbards barn; thence S 14° W 12.12 poles to a stone on the northeast side of road; thence S 2° 30' W 20.45 poles to a stone thence S 12° 30' W 49.81 poles crossing Peters Creek to a stone on east side of road; thence N 81° E 69.87 poles to a stone corner on Goodykoontz line; thence N 73° 30' E 66.72 poles to beginning, and containing 277.30 acres, calculated by latitude and departure upon the double meridian distance of each course respectively. The above metes and bounds are based upon the magnetic meridian as taken with the instrument at this date, March 9th, 1908.
